Imaginative Artistry on the 'Island of Yes.'

Objective:

To inspire creativity and artistic expression using 'The Nays Find Their Way.' as a guide.

To encourage children to visualize and illustrate their own adventures on the 'Island of Yes.'



Introduction:

1. Book Connection

Begin by revisiting key elements of 'The Nays Find Their Way,'

Conclusion:

8. Creative Art Certificates



 Award "Creative Art Certificates" to recognise each child/group's imaginative contributions to the 'Island of Yes' artworks.

9. Artistic Island Celebration

 Conclude the lesson with a mini "Artistic Island Celebration" where children can share what they loved most about creating their visions of the 'Island of Yes.'

Homework/Extension Activity:

10. Create a Storyboard

 Assign children the task of creating a storyboard for a short animation or comic strip, depicting a new adventure on the Island of Yes.

11. Island Art Showcase Assembly

 Host an "Island Art Showcase' assembly where children present their storyboards and discuss the unique elements of their imagined adventures.

Adjust the lesson plan to suit the age range and learning abilities of the children.
